

Due to the amazing success of our historic trail running through Kirk Ella & West Ella, we have now added a further two new blue plaques giving us a total of twenty two. The first of the recent additions is on Elm Brae cottage in Church Lane which was originally an estate cottage built for employees of The Elms. When the Hull to Barnsley railway line was being built it became a hospital for casualties until the work was completed. Our latest addition in School Lane draws your attention to what used to be the Victorian Police House built in 1895. In those days people thought that there was a secret passage direct to the village lock up!

PARISH COUNCIL TAX

The good news is that the Precept, (the amount allocated to the Parish by ERYC) remains unchanged. In actual fact, because of the increase in the number of new properties in the Parish, individual bills will be slightly reduced! Cllr. Stan Raymond is the Chairman of the Finance Group.

PLANNING

Any resident who feels strongly about a planning application may contact us for advice but please put any objections down in writing to ERYC Planning Department, the place where the decisions are made. Cllr. Doreen Kaye is the Chairman of the Planning Group.

PAVEMENTS & GRASS VERGES

Your concerns often involve the condition of pavements and grass verges. These are the responsibility of the ERYC. There is a rolling programme of grass cutting throughout the growing season. Likewise pavement repairs are on a similar but less frequent rolling programme.

LYTIPPING

As a householder or business you have a legal obligation, called your Duty of Care, to take all reasonable measures to ensure that your waste is disposed of properly. Environmental Protection (Duty of Care) Regulations require all householders and businesses to make sure their waste is only removed from their premises by registered waste carriers. This means that unless you make the necessary checks you can be responsible for someone else fly-tipping your waste. So please ensure you obtain evidence that the person/company removing any waste from your property has a Waste Carriers Licence.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

The Police regularly provide up to date information, regarding incidents in our area, to Jean Harne and Phil Williamson who have run the West Ella Grapevine for 19 years. Tom Fry represents Kirk Ella on the web but more Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinators are urgently required. We are most grateful to Jean, Phil and Tom for the excellent work they are continuing to do for our communities.

SCAMS

The local police advice is to continue to be vigilant of phone calls that mention your bank account or money being taken out. You are then asked for your bank details on the pretence that the caller is going to avoid any more being debited. Genuine callers would never ask you to disclose your bank details. The tricksters are becoming more inventive so if in doubt look at www.actionforpolice.uk or phone Action Fraud 0300 123 2040.

DOG FOULING

It has come to the attention of the Parish Council that there has been an increase in dog fouling in the Parish, which is an offence under the Public Spaces Protection Order 2016. This can lead to a fine of £75 or summary proceedings, which may result in a fine of up to £1000. Dog fouling can also lead to diseases such as Toxcana Canis. SOUTH ELLA SCHOOL SITE

Many of you are interested to know what is to become of the Wolfreton Upper School site in South Ella Way. The land has been sold by the ERYC to Lovell Partnership Ltd. An application was received by the ERYC Planning Department from them on 14th February, for the erection of 240 dwellings on the site. At the time of going to the printers we have no further information.
