2. Community Priorities

a. Residential Burglaries

Although a slight reduction of Residential Burglaries/attempt burglaries in February, throughout March, staff from all Wards will continue with high visibility reassurance patrols to deter residential burglaries/attempt burglaries this month.

b. Vehicle Crime

Last month saw a high rise of vehicle crime, including, theft from, theft of and criminal damage. At least 15 reported cases. Throughout March we will continue with high visibility reassurance patrols to deter these offences.

c. Shop theft

Last month saw a high rise of shop thefts, at least 16 reported offences. Throughout March we will continue with high visibility reassurance patrols to deter shop thefts.

1. Crime Reduction Advice

Spring is finally here, time to get into the garden or a visit to the allotment. Here is some practical, simple advice to Beat the Garden Thief:

SHEDUCATION

 \underline{S} ecure the access to your shed or garage by locking gates and using thorny bushes next to walls and fences.

Have you visibly marked the contents of your shed? Make a note of serial numbers and photograph valuable plants and ornaments.

 $\underline{\boldsymbol{E}}$ xternal security lights which are activated by movement are a useful deterrent.

Doors of sheds require attention. Use strong padbars and close shackle padlocks. Up and over garage doors supplied with standard lock fittings should also be fitted with a padlock or lockable bolt. Windows should be secured with locks or grilles.

 \underline{U} se coach bolts or non-return screws to secure door hinges.

Chain cycles, mowers, ladders and tools to a strong anchorage point.

 $m{A}$ larms for sheds and garages are available for under £20 at most DIY stores, catalogue shops and builders merchants.

 \underline{T} ogether we'll crack crime. Join a home watch scheme.
