2. Crime issues of particular note

The following list shows some of the crimes that have occurred in the previous month in your area.

- A high number of shop thefts during July across all Wards resulting in arrests made for some. During August our community patrols will once again continue to deliver high visibility reassurance to members of the public. Any intelligence re this issue can be submitted by calling Crime Stoppers 0800 555 111 or Humberside Police 101.
- 9 reports of vehicle related crime across all Wards last month, one of which involves unknown persons remove fencing from a building site, Beal Homes to gain access to building site and remove excavator by unknown means.
- 5 reported cases of residential burglaries during July, down from last month's figures. During August our community patrols will continue to deliver high visibility reassurance to members of the public.

3. Community Priorities

Crime prevention

During August officers will be attending numerous public events where we will be giving advice on how to keep property secure and safe. We will be offering information on how to join Immobilise.com and join My Community Alert. Officers will be continuing in the door to door survey called Humbertalking, talking to residents and listening to their concerns.

4. Crime Reduction Advice

Protect your home while you are on holiday. Don't leave your house looking unoccupied.

- Mow the lawn before you leave so that it doesn't look like a meadow by the time you get back.
- Leave curtains and blinds open – nothing reveals that a house is unoccupied so much as curtains drawn during the day.
- Cancel milk and newspapers and any other regular deliveries.
- Ask a neighbour to remove free newspapers and post from your doormat if they can be seen through a glass panel or through the letterbox.
- Install a light on a timer switch that comes on in the evening. If you are using a light on a timer, don't use it with a table lamp that can be viewed through a window – a dead giveaway.

Keep your valuables safe

- Keep valuables out of sight and don't leave them where they can be seen through a window.
- If you conceal valuables in your home, avoid obvious hiding places such as your sock drawer or in a fake food can in the kitchen – burglars are wise to this trick.
- Try not to leave anything you would hate to lose in the house while you are away
- Given that most burglars are opportunists and their motive is generally to get in, get something of value and then get out as fast as possible, your intruder might be encouraged to leave after finding a fake hoard rather than turning your house upside down to find anything of real value.

Don't tell everyone you're on holiday

- Don't tell people outside immediate friends and family that you are going away or for how long.
- Don't talk about your planned holiday on social media - you don't know who can read your comments, or who they will tell.

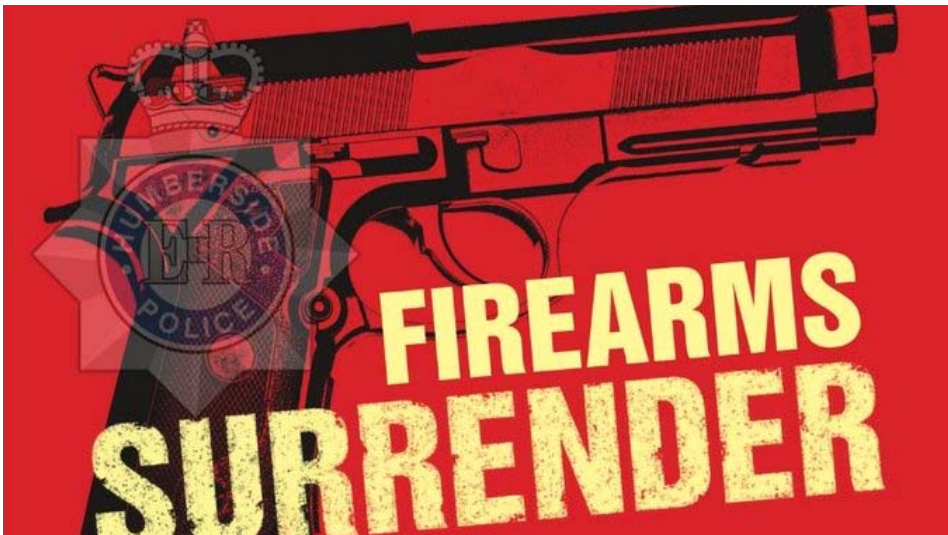
